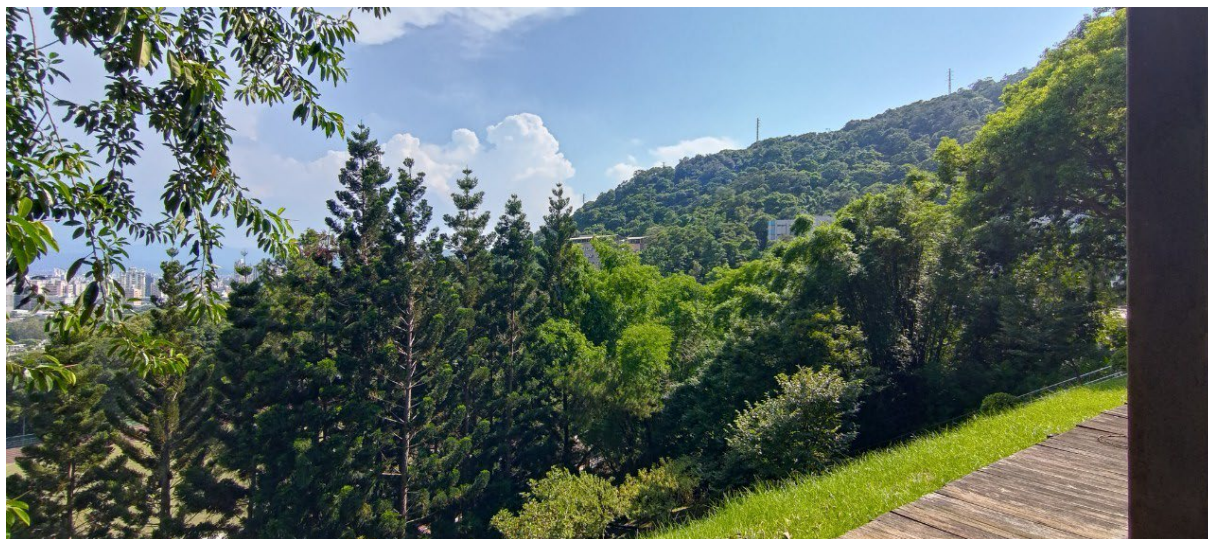
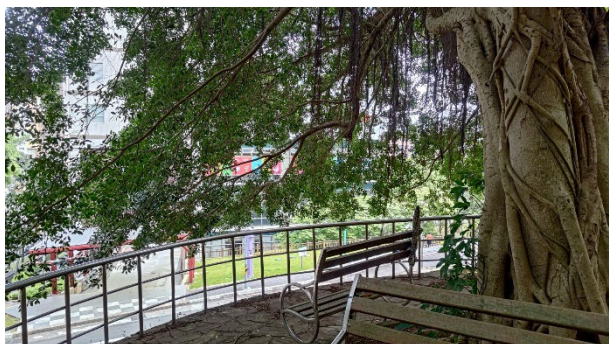


11.2.1 Public access to buildings

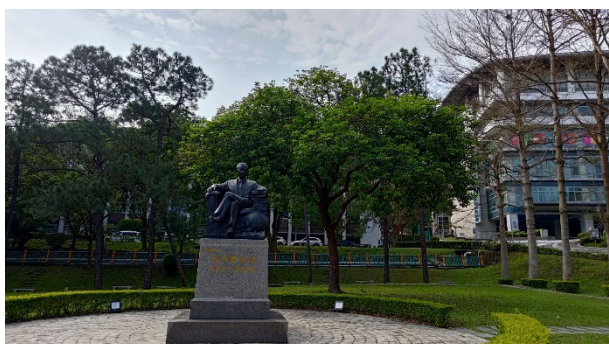
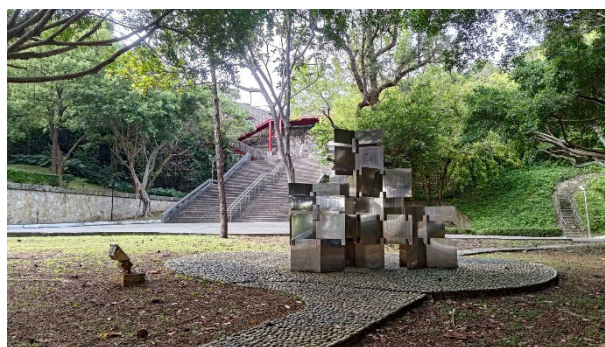
